## Christmas may be over, but in the Huon Valley the holly berries are only just starting to ripen.

Despite its cheerful associations, European holly (*ilex aquifolium*) is an invasive weed in Tasmania. The bright red berries are readily spread by birds, and holly can quickly outcompete surrounding vegetation and choke up waterways. Last year, European holly became a declared weed under the *Tasmanian Weed Act 1999*, which means that if you have holly on your property, you may have a legal obligation to control it.

Huon Valley Council's Natural Resource Management team is currently undertaking a survey of holly in the municipal area.
