Now Open: Huon Valley Council's 2021/22 Community Grants Program

Huon Valley Council is pleased to announce that the 2021/22 Community Grants Program with a total pool of \$55,000 is now open for applications.

The 2021/22 Community Grants Program provides financial assistance and in-kind support to projects that involve, engage, and benefit the Huon Valley Community.

The total funding of \$55,000 is split across 3 areas with up to \$1,000 available for individuals and community groups with activities that support community, creative and Town Team Projects that can be completed before 30 December 2022. The funding is:

- \$25,000 for community projects
- \$10,000 for creative projects
- \$20,000 for Town Teams projects

Mayor Bec Enders said, "We are thrilled to launch a community grants program that supports projects, programs, and services that promote community connection and enhances the diversity of cultural, creative and health and well-being in the Huon."

"We are pleased that the grants program now includes an additional \$10,000 for creative projects that directly enhances the vibrant arts and culture sector of the community and \$20,000 for town teams which support place-based activation and/or beautification of a town."

"We are keen to see grants that utilise local goods and services wherever possible, and enhance the Huon Valley as a prosperous, vibrant, and caring. By supporting community-led projects and partnerships between charities, community groups or other organisations we also aim to build community capacity and resilience."

Last year's trial of a quick response model allowed people to apply for the funding at any time with a shorter turnaround. This proved popular with Council receiving more eligible applications than in previous years.
