## Volunteers – we say thank you!

Huon Valley Commissioner Adriana Taylor encourages all residents of the Huon Valley to congratulate volunteers on the vital roles they play in our community as we celebrate National Volunteer Week 8-14 May.

"Volunteers actively contribute to our quality of life in the Valley. It is quite daunting to consider the things we would lose without their valuable contributions to our way of life.

"Volunteering 'employs' more people in Tasmania than the agriculture, forestry, fishing and mining industries combined. In fact, volunteers made an effective contribution of \$638.1 million to the Tasmanian economy in 2013\*. Statistics don't really convey the magnitude of the benefits volunteering provides.

"Hopefully you won't need to call the State Emergency Services (SES) but if you do, you'll be looked after by volunteers. They are often the first responders to local car accidents, or when your house loses a roof, or during the recent Huonville flood, in the cold, or on a wet night," Commissioner Taylor said.

"The volunteer firefighters, the mums and dads at your child's sporting event, those caring for family members at home, the men and women who donate their time to the Southbridge Waste Transfer station, helping our environment, they all donate their time willingly for the good of the community.

"The Taste of the Huon, the Cygnet Folk Festival, the Mid Winter Fest – these are all events that bring thousands of visitors to, and raise the profile of the Valley and they all rely on volunteers to ensure they run smoothly.

"Thank you for giving up your valuable time so that we can all enjoy life a little more. I know a lot of volunteers don't ask for recognition, so National Volunteer Week is a great way to acknowledge them and their civic participation.

"Please take the time during National Volunteer Week to say thank you to your local volunteers, I believe we would literally be lost without them," Commissioner Taylor said.
